
As nourishment for these not-soordinary times we offer the following passage from St. Francis de Sales.


"Our greatest fault is that we wish to serve God in <u>our</u> way, not in His way -according to our will, not according to His will.



And this is not because the things we desire may be more pleasing to Him, but because they are more to our taste.

This is certainly the greatest obstacle we can raise to our own perfection, for it is beyond doubt that if we were to wish to be Saints according to our own will, we shall never be so at all. To be truly a Saint, it is necessary to be one according to the Will of God."

CONCERN FOR OUR COUNTRY


So many of you have spoken with us about your sense that there is an increasingly grave situation in our country; and your conviction that a growing evil is taking hold.

We also are concerned. We know that, at its root, the evil which is confronting us – and the whole world – draws its power from the ancient serpent. "For we are not contending against flesh and blood, but against the principalities, against the powers, against the world rulers of this present darkness, against the spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places." Ephesians 6:12 (See the rest of Chapter 6 for St. Paul's cogent advice.)

How does one respond to this evil? The first, most powerful, and ultimate response is the one that Jesus gave by His Sacrifice and death on the Cross. And each day in the Mass that Response is brought to bear against all evil, and to restore hope.

The second is by our continuing personal conversion. By participating in the Mass, by adoring Him in the Blessed Sacrament, by surrendering to His Will in our daily lives, by uniting our sorrow and pain with that of Jesus on the Cross we are acting and responding in the most powerful way possible. Because then it is Jesus Who is responding through us.

In this critical time, we invite you to join with us in intense prayer, begging God to disarm the forces of evil and to have mercy on our country.
